Who can find the most pairs?

A first memo game for 2 or more children, ages 2 1/2 years and up

Players:	2 or more players, ages 2 1/2 years and up
Contents:	24 Picture pieces (12 pairs) Instructions

Advice for parents

It is a good idea before playing this game for the first time, to show players all the pieces so that they can recognize the pairs later.

Preparation for the game

All 24 pieces are shuffled and laid face down on the table.

Aim of the game

Each player should try to collect as many pairs as possible.

How to play

The youngest player starts by turning over two pieces so that everyone may see them. If they match he may keep them. If not he turns them face down and the next person plays.

End of the game

The game ends when all the pairs have been found by the players.

Game Variation

With this variation the purpose is not to find a pair with the same picture but to find two pieces with the same theme: the umbrella and the wellington boots, the flower and the watering can, the airplane and the bird, the house and the front door, the lion and the dog, the toy rabbit and the teddy bear. All the other rules apply as before. Perhaps you can find other pairs that belong together!
